Dealing with Divisions

1 Corinthians 1:10-17

1 Corinthians 1:13-17

1 Corinthians 1:10-11

1 Corinthians 1:11-12

Memory Verse: “ Now I exhort you, brethren, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that you all agree and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be made complete in the same mind and in the same judgment. 1 Corinthians 1:10

Mon—Read 1 Corinthians 1:10. On what basis did Paul exhort them regarding disunity? How does this tie with change based on who you are in Christ?

Tues—Read 1 Corinthians 1:11 and James 4:1-4. According to Scripture, what is the source(s) of quarrels among the people of God? Are there ways in which you may be quarrelling with fellow believers for the same reasons?

Wed—Read 1 Corinthians 1:12-13. What is Paul’s call for unity founded on? What work do we need to do in our hearts if we are quarrelling with someone or causing division among God’s people?

Thurs—Read 1 Corinthians 1:14-16. In this passage, why does Paul “thank God” that he only baptized three people while he was in Corinth? What point is God, through Paul, making for us today?

Fri—Read 1 Corinthians 1:17; Matthew 28:18-20; Acts 2:41; Acts 9:10.-19
Jesus commanded baptism, the early church practiced it and Paul himself was baptized. What does his statement in 1 Corinthians 1:17 mean? How does it reflect the need for the functional centrality of the gospel in the church?

Sat—Read 1 Corinthians 1:18 - 2:5. Reflect on the power of the Spirit in the Gospel message. Prepare yourself to worship “in spirit and in truth” tomorrow.
