Jesus' Teaching on Marital Fidelity and Divorce

Matthew 5:27-32 #6 Sermon on the Mount Steve King, Senior Pastor

God's call to marital fidelity-the standard and how to keep it

²⁷"You have heard that it was said, 'YOU SHALL NOT COMMIT ADULTERY'; ²⁸but I say to you that everyone who looks at a woman with lust for her has already committed adultery with her in his heart. ²⁹If your right eye makes you stumble, tear it out and throw it from you; for it is better for you to lose one of the parts of your body, than for your whole body to be thrown into hell. ³⁰If your right hand makes you stumble, cut it off and throw it from you; for it is better for you to lose one of the parts of your body, than for your whole body to go into hell." (Matthew 5:27-30)

What about divorce and remarriage?

³¹ "It was said, 'WHOEVER SENDS HIS WIFE AWAY, LET HIM GIVE HER A CERTIFICATE OF DIVORCE'; ³² but I say to you that everyone who divorces his wife, except for *the* reason of unchastity, makes her commit adultery; and whoever marries a divorced woman commits adultery." (Matthew 5:31-32)

REFLECTION QUESTIONS:

Monday: Read Genesis 2:18-25 and write a definition of marriage from the text. Who is involved in the union and what are five relational aspects to it?

Tuesday: Read Deuteronomy 24:1-4; 22:13-19; Leviticus 21:7, 14; Ezra 10:1-19; Nehemiah 13:23-27; Deuteronomy 7:3-4; Isaiah 50:1 and Malachi 2:14-16. What guiding principles regarding divorce and remarriage do you discover?

Wednesday: Read Matthew 1:18-19; 5:31-32, and 19:1-12. What did Jesus teach about divorce and remarriage and how was His own home threatened by a possible divorce?

Thursday: Read Romans 7:1-3; 1 Corinthians 7:10-16, 39; and 1 Timothy 5:14. What principles do you discover regarding divorce and remarriage?

Friday: Review the Scriptures from this week's reflection questions and outline God's view of marriage and divorce. How does the gospel give you hope in the context of marital difficulties?

Saturday: Read Matthew 5:33-37. Prepare your heart for Sunday worship, and bring a friend with you to church tomorrow.
