The Laying on of Hands

The laying on of hands is a symbolic act that recognizes God setting an individual apart for blessing and ministry.

By the laying on of hands, Jacob blessed his twelve sons (Genesis 48:12-20), Israel commissioned priests and Moses commissioned Joshua (Numbers 8:10; 27:18).

By the laying on of hands, Jesus and the apostles healed and blessed people (Matthew 9:18; 19:13-15; Acts 9:12, 17), the early church commissioned and commended leaders (Acts 6:6; 13:1-3; 1 Timothy 4:14; 5:22) and offered prayer for the sick (James 5:14-15).
